




Students in Atlantic Canada (76%) and Manitoba (76%) are more likely to support increased federal health transfers.


FOR THE SECOND YEAR IN A ROW, STUDENTS FAVOUR FREE POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION

DESPITE ECONOMIC UNCERTAINTY, STUDENTS ARE CONFIDENT ABOUT THEIR JOB PROSPECTS...








Atlantic provinces (90%) and Quebec (90%) are the most confident about their future job prospects.

61% of students believe that Canada should introduce an excess profit tax on big companies that have profited from the COVID-19 pandemic.







Students in Saskatchewan (68%) and Alberta (64%) are the most likely to support an excess profit tax.








Students in Alberta (57%) and Saskatchewan (58%) would like the government to provide more support to the oil and gas industry.

BACKGROUND & METHODOLOGY




The **Student Budget Consultation** is a civic education and financial literacy initiative for high school students across Canada. The program gives young people an opportunity to learn about public finance and the economy, debate political issues and offer their own opinion on the priorities of the federal budget.

In conjunction with the 2021 federal budget, Canadian high school students were consulted on budget priorities using an online questionnaire. In total, more than 6,000 students from every province and territory in Canada participated between February and April 2021.


Canadian census data has been used to weight the findings to reflect the distribution of males and females, aged 12 to 18, in Canada. This report also includes incomplete responses,


meaning that sample sizes will vary from question to question. Due to rounding, percentages presented throughout this document may not add up to 100 per cent or precisely reflect the absolute figures.

Deputy Prime Minister and **Finance Minister Chrystia Freeland** met virtually with twelve Student
Budget Consultation participants to discuss their priorities
for the post-pandemic recovery. A preliminary report on
the survey results was also shared with the Department of
Finance during the pre-budget consultation period.

STUDENT **VOTE**.
