




Male students are more in favour of balancing the budget than female students.

The majority of students remain confident about their future job prospects.


When you finish school, how confident are you that you will find a job that interests you within Canada?




What is the most important step the federal government could take to assist families?







BACKGROUND & METHODOLOGY


The **Student Budget Consultation** is a civic education and financial literacy program for high school students across Canada. The process gives young people an opportunity to learn about government revenues and expenditures, debate political issues and offer their own opinion on the priorities of the federal budget.



In conjunction with the 2019 federal budget, Canadian high school students were consulted on budget priorities using online and paper-based questionnaires. In total, more than 8,000 students from every province and territory in Canada participated between November 2018 and March 2019.

Canadian census data has been used to weight the findings to reflect reflect the distribution

of males and females, aged 12 to 18, in Canada. This report also includes incomplete responses, meaning that sample sizes will vary from question to question. A subset of 2018 Student Budget Consultation data was used in this report, in order to maximize comparability with this year's sample of students. Due to rounding, percentages presented throughout this document may not add up to 100 per cent and precisely reflect the absolute figures.
